In case of an earthquake

Valve will shut off gas

Earthquake preparedness has recently become a common topic for homeowners, property owners, businesses, as well as governmental agencies and the media.

When the Loma Prieta earthquake struck this area twenty years ago, many areas discovered how vulnerable they were to the aftermath of a natural gas leak after the tremor.



This spring a new company, called *Earthquake IQ*, headquartered in Los Gatos, began to market an automatic shutoff valve manufactured by Little Firefighter in Santa Ana.

About 4' x 4" in size, the valve is designed to be placed on the property owner side of the gas meter and when an earthquake is felt to be 5.4 or higher, the valve automatically shuts off the gas to the building.

Installation is by a licensed technician or plumber. (More details on the service provided is available at their website: www.earthquakeiq.com.)

The entrepreneurs who have started this service are hoping to convince insurance companies to give discounts to homeowners who have installed an automatic gas shutoff valves. Some counties in the Los Angeles area have mandated the installation of a shutoff device on new and remodeled residences.
